

## Road map for breeders and stud dog owners – check list to print out and check off upon completion

Everyone who wants to breed should familiarize themselves with the Breeding Regulations of the KIM Association. You will find the most important information in the checklist below.

Formalities for breeders	Done (X)
<p><b>1. Apply for international kennel registration</b> (breeders only)</p> <p>Download the application for international kennel registration at <a href="https://klm-gna.org/breeding-forms">https://klm-gna.org/breeding-forms</a> and submit it to the KIM-GNA Breed Warden.</p> <p><b>Attention:</b> Since 01.01.2016 international kennel registration must be applied for, and <b>the processing time can take up to 3 months.</b></p>	
<p><b>Please <u>include the following</u>:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Proof</b> must be provided that the future <b>breeder</b> has <b>handled at least 1 dog himself/herself at JGHV tests and a Breed Show required for breeding eligibility.</b></li> </ul> <p>Copies of the <b>relevant test certificates</b> (VJP/FB 3, HZP/FB 5, VGP/FB 7), and the Breed Show evaluation sheet must be enclosed with the application for kennel registration.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Copy of a current hunting or falconry license</b></li> <li>• <b>Proof of membership</b> in a Landesgruppe of the KIM Association</li> <li>• <b>Proof of the completed kennel inspection</b></li> </ul> <p><b>Once all documents are received, the Breed Warden sends them to the Office of Breed Registry.</b></p>	
<p><b>2. Before approval of the 1st litter, the kennel and breeding facilities</b> (breeders only) must be inspected by the Breed Warden or their representative.</p> <p><b>Note:</b> The kennel inspection is done before applying for a kennel name and in case of changes, e.g. due to a move or a building project. For subsequent litters, the inspection will be made at the litter inspection.</p>	
<p><b>3. Copies of the following documents of the breeding dog</b> must be submitted to the Breed Warden of the Landesgruppe who forwards them to the Breed Warden of the Association for inclusion in the KIM Magazine and Association website.</p> <p>If the dog passes further tests, these score sheets must be submitted immediately in the same manner.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Copy of the pedigree (<i>Stammtafel</i>)</li> <li>• Score sheets from all tests (at least VJP and HZP with at least 6 points in the subject "Independent search with duck in dense cover")</li> </ul>	

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Proof of scent or sight Laut</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Breed show report</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• HD evaluation form</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ectopic ureter evaluation form</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Photo of the bitch / stud dog – full profile view</li> </ul>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Minimum breeding age 18 months</li> </ul>	
<p>4. International kennel registration must be granted before breeding. The choice of a stud dog is up to each breeder within the framework of the KIM Breeding Regulations.</p>	
<p>5. Please comply with the requirements of the Breeding Regulations.  <b>At least 4 weeks before the expected heat cycle, the planned pairing must be discussed and registered in writing with the Breed Warden of the Landesgruppe.</b>  Summer litters (July, August, September) are <b>not encouraged!!!</b></p> <p>It is recommended that the breeder contacts the stud dog owner several months in advance to discuss stud fee, anticipated breeding date, and other issues.</p> <p>When the bitch is in heat; the breeder notifies the stud dog owner and arranges breeding.</p> <p>Both dogs get brucellosis tests with results prior to breeding.  The stud dog undergoes a sperm analysis, if not successfully bred within the past 6 months.</p>	
<p>6. The stud dog owner records dates of all successful breedings and contacts the Breed Warden within 5 days of completion of breeding.</p> <p>The stud dog owner pays for Mating Certificate on the KIM-GNA website and sends a copy of the receipt to the GNA Breed Warden.</p> <p>The Breed Warden reports the expected litters for publication in the KIM Magazine.</p>	
<p>7. Breed Warden contacts Association Breed Book Registrar to request the Mating Certificate.</p> <p>Association Breed Book Registrar sends the Mating Certificate to the Breed Warden, who then sends it to the stud dog owner.</p> <p>The breeder pays the stud fee agreed upon with the stud dog owner.</p> <p>The stud dog owner fills out the Mating Certificate completely and sends it to the breeder once pregnancy is determined.</p>	

<p>8. After the litter is born, the breeder notifies the Breed Warden within 5 days.</p> <p><b>IMPORTANT!!!</b></p> <p><b><u>The breeder mails the bitch's original <i>Stammtafel</i> to the Breed Book Registrar (Jacqueline Mette) tri-folded in a normal letter envelope with the appropriate international postage immediately after the birth of the puppies.</u></b></p> <p><b>Recommendation: Do not send these documents by registered mail!</b></p>	
<p>9. Within 10 days of the birth of the litter or as soon as coloration can be determined, the breeder fills out the following registration forms (see <a href="http://www.klm-gna.org/breeding-forms">www.klm-gna.org/breeding-forms</a>) and mails them to the GNA Breed Warden:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Application for Litter Registration form</li> <li>2. Form for the Calculation of the Litter Registration Fee Breeder remits payment by check to the KIM-GNA Treasurer or via the KIM-GNA website shop (<a href="https://klm-gna.org/shop">https://klm-gna.org/shop</a>), otherwise, the litter will not be registered.</li> <li>3. Mating Certificate</li> <li>4. Photocopy of a check or online receipt for litter registration fees</li> <li>5. Any special approval letters granted by the Association Breed Warden or Breeding Commission (e.g. breeding lease, artificial insemination).</li> </ol>	
<p>10. <u>Breed Warden sends the application for litter registration, the mating certificate, the form for the Calculation of the Litter Registration Fee, and any special permissions to the Office of Breed Registry, within 1-2 weeks after the litter has been whelped.</u> (From the date of receipt by the Office of Breed Registry, it takes about 5 weeks for the pedigrees and chips to be received by the breeder from the Office of Breed Registry).</p> <p>Breeder receives <i>Stammtafel</i> for puppies, bitch's <i>Stammtafel</i>, microchips, and Puppy Record Sheet (<i>Welpenerfassungsbogen</i>) from the Office of Breed Registry.</p> <p>The breeder dates and signs the inside (bottom left) of the <i>Stammtafel</i> when they are received from the Office of Breed Registry.</p>	
<p>11. Breed Warden arranges date for the Litter Inspection which is performed after the puppies are 7 weeks old, at the earliest.</p> <p>Microchips sent by the KIM Association are inserted at, or prior to, the litter inspection. The inspection must be done by the Breed Warden or Deputy Breed Warden of KIM-GNA or an authorized Agent who may be a Breed</p>	

<p>Warden of another JGHV member Club, or a veterinarian. The veterinarian may vaccinate the puppies and chip them, if the breeder prefers, or as the authorized agent of the Breed Warden. If the Breed Warden chips the puppies, the vaccination should be completed before the litter inspection.</p> <p>Litter Inspection Form and copy of breeder's Kennel Book is sent to the Breed Warden, if inspection was done by an Agent of the Breed Warden.</p>	
<p><b>12.</b> The kennel's Breed Book must be maintained (see Breeding Regulations for contents), which must be presented to the Breed Warden at the litter inspection. A three-ringed binder or a digital file, in which the breeder keeps all documents, is sufficient for this purpose.</p>	
<p><b>13.</b> The first deworming of the puppies should be done around the 14<sup>th</sup> day of life (including the bitch, if not on a pre-natal deworming protocol). The puppies and the bitch should be dewormed a minimum of 3 times, recommended every two weeks.</p>	
<p><b>14. Proof of vaccination</b> must be available when the litter is picked up.</p>	
<p><b>15.</b> Puppies may be sent home after they have reached 8 weeks old, at the earliest.</p> <p>To verify the identity of the puppy, <b>a chip reader must be available at the time of pick up.</b></p> <p>The puppies' <i>Stammtafel</i> is signed over by the breeder to the buyer at the bottom of the last page of the <i>Stammtafel</i>. The name and address of the buyer must be all in one box. The Puppy Record Sheet is completed by the breeder and then signed by the buyer. Within 2 weeks, the Puppy Record Sheet is sent to Breed Warden who sends it to the Office of Breed Registry.</p> <p>If some puppies have not been sold yet, they can be registered later.</p>
